Title:	3 die, hundreds down with fever in district Budaun, Uttar Pradesh

Three persons, including two minors, died of suspected fever in a village in Badaun on Sunday, while hundreds of other villagers are suffering from fever. After receiving the information, a team of health experts visited the village.

According to sources, Rinki (17), Lovekesh (18) and Bhupendra (7), all residents of Pepal village in Wazirganj block, died due to fever. The chief medical officer (CMO) of Badaun sent a team of doctors and pharmacists to the village. The health experts examined 165 persons who were suffering from fever. Of these, doctors took blood slides of 78 persons to check whether they have been suffering from malaria or dengue. Three patients were administered IV drips. The team distributed medicines among affected villagers.

CMO Dr Nemi Chandra said, "Our team found that Rinki had been having fever for three days and severe pain in the stomach. She died on her way to the hospital and it is suspected that she had typhoid. However, fever did not claim the lives of the other two villagers. Bhupendra had stopped urinating on the intervening night of August 26 and 27. Lovekesh was fine on August 25 but later started vomiting and foaming in the mouth."

The team of health experts found piles of garbage and water logging in the village. "Our team sprayed anti-larvae compounds and conducted fogging exercise there. I have asked ASHAs (Accredited Social Health Activists) and ANMs (Auxiliary Nurse Midwives) to ensure that villagers do not store water in their house, to control mosquito breeding. The team of doctors will continue to visit Pepal for the next five days. We are awaiting report of blood slides which will be ready by Monday. If it comes to light that villagers are suffering from malaria or dengue, doctors will keep visiting the village till the situation is brought under control," Chandra added.
