Title:	80 students fall ill after consuming food at NCC Camp in district Allahabad, Uttar Pradesh

Nearly 80 cadets of National Cadet Corps fell ill after consuming food during an NCC camp at KP Intermediate College in Allahabad on Monday, students claimed. However, the DM claimed that around 30 students were admitted to Beli hospital and some were taken to Swaroop Rani Hospital. Condition of some was said to be serious. ALLAHABAD: Nearly 80 cadets of National Cadet Corps (NCC) fell ill after having food in their camp at KP Intermediate College in Allahabad on Monday night, students claimed.

However, the DM claimed that around 30 students were admitted to Beli hospital and some were taken to Swaroop Rani Nehru Hospital. Condition of some of them was reported to be serious.

Allahabad district magistrate Suhas LY and senior police officials visited hospitals to enquire about the well being of the students.

The cadets at the NCC camp alleged that sub standard quality of food was being given to them. The hygienic conditions at the camp were poor and the cadets used same water for toilet as well as drinking purpose, they alleged.

The officials at the camp did not pay heed to their complaints and instead silenced them on different pretexts, they further alleged.

The district magistrate said the nine-day camp was held under 15 UP Battalion and had at least 537 students, including girls of class ninth to graduation from different schools and institutions including Allahabad University.

As per the DM, every affected student was being closely monitored. He added that an enquiry will be set up to probe the incident. Senior army officials were being contacted as the issue pertained to 15 UP Battalion.

On receiving information, panicked parents of the students rushed to the hospitals alleging anomalies in the arrangements at the camps. The condition of 80 students, including some girls, started deteriorating soon after they consumed food, cadets claimed.

Students of Allahabad University in large numbers also reached the hospitals as the news of the incident spread.
