The number of dengue patients is increasing day by day in Cuttack. So far 100 dengue patients have been identified in the city. Dengue terror is increasing in the city. The number of dengue patients is increasing, especially in the CDA region. So far, more than 100 patients have been identified in the city. While the increasing number of patients has become a cause of concern for the CMC, Cuttack Mayor Subhas Singh said that they are prepared for all situations. The mayor said that CDA area is being given special importance while cleaning the places where the garbage has fallen in different parts of the city.

In the CDA area, the CMC is cutting down unplanted trees in many places. From house to house, the CMC staff are raising awareness and discussing how people can avoid dengue. The CMC has asked to drain the water immediately. An order has been issued to take action against throwing garbage in empty places. The Cuttack mayor said that the health department is also aware of the situation.
