Title:	More than hundred sick with fever in jalalpur, one died, 14 malaria cases in Kanpur Dehat, Uttar Pradesh

Fever killed an innocent in Jalalpur village of Saravankheda block on Tuesday amid the knock of dengue and malaria in the district. More than a hundred people in the village are suffering from fever.

Of these, 14 people have been found to be suffering from malaria in the test done with the kit. The Health Department team conducted a camp in the village and examined 119 patients suffering from fever. This is the first death in the district due to fever in this season.

In Jalalpur village, people have been suffering from fever for a long time. On information, the health department team once completed the formalities by setting up a camp.

On Tuesday, village resident Kamta's five-year-old daughter Pari, who was suffering from fever, died during treatment in a private hospital. Innocent's aunt Shikha said that Pari was admitted to a private hospital in Akbarpur four days ago after she had fever.

On the other hand, on the information of the death of the innocent suffering from fever, the health department team reached the village and set up a camp in the primary school and examined the people. Along with this, anti-larva drug was sprayed from house to house.

A total of 119 people were examined and given medicines in the camp organized in the village. In this kit, 14 people including Dharmendra (10), Anju (8), Chirag (7), Santoshi (6), Lado (7), Kamlesh (11), Arjun (5) of the village were found to be malaria infected.

District Malaria Officer Maruti Dixit said that mosquito larvae have been found in waterlogged places in the village. Anti-larvae has been sprayed here. Documents related to the treatment were sought from the family members of the child, but they could not be shown.

Officers woke up on the death of an innocent, spraying of anti-larvae in the village Fever is spreading in Jalalpur village since many days. people are sick But the health department remained unconcerned. When the officials woke up after the death of the innocent on Tuesday, the health workers sprayed anti-larvae in the village. Doctors were also seen seeing larvae in the collected water. People say that if the malaria and health department had been alert earlier, the innocent's life would have been saved. Still more than a hundred people are ill in the village.

369 fever victims were treated in the district

CMO Dr. AK Singh said that 250 patients suffering from fever have been treated in the district hospital, CHC and PHC. In Jalalpur village, 119 fever victims were examined and given medicines. In the investigation of 557 water vessels, water was found in 228. Anti-larvae spraying has been done in the village. 14 people have been found infected with malaria in Jalalpur village and three in the district hospital. 20 people were tested for dengue in the entire district. None were found infected. Till now only one dengue infected youth had come in the district. The CMO said that no person infected with malaria and dengue should get treatment through quacks under any circumstances. He appealed to the people to go to the health centers and get the patients treated. Medicines and testing resources are available here.
