



Out of 12 serum and CSF samples sent to National Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), Delhi, none tested positive for Japanese Encephalitis. Cause of death being investigated. No deaths have been reported after 15.07.09. Health education being given about personal prophylactic measures.
