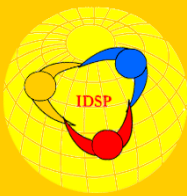

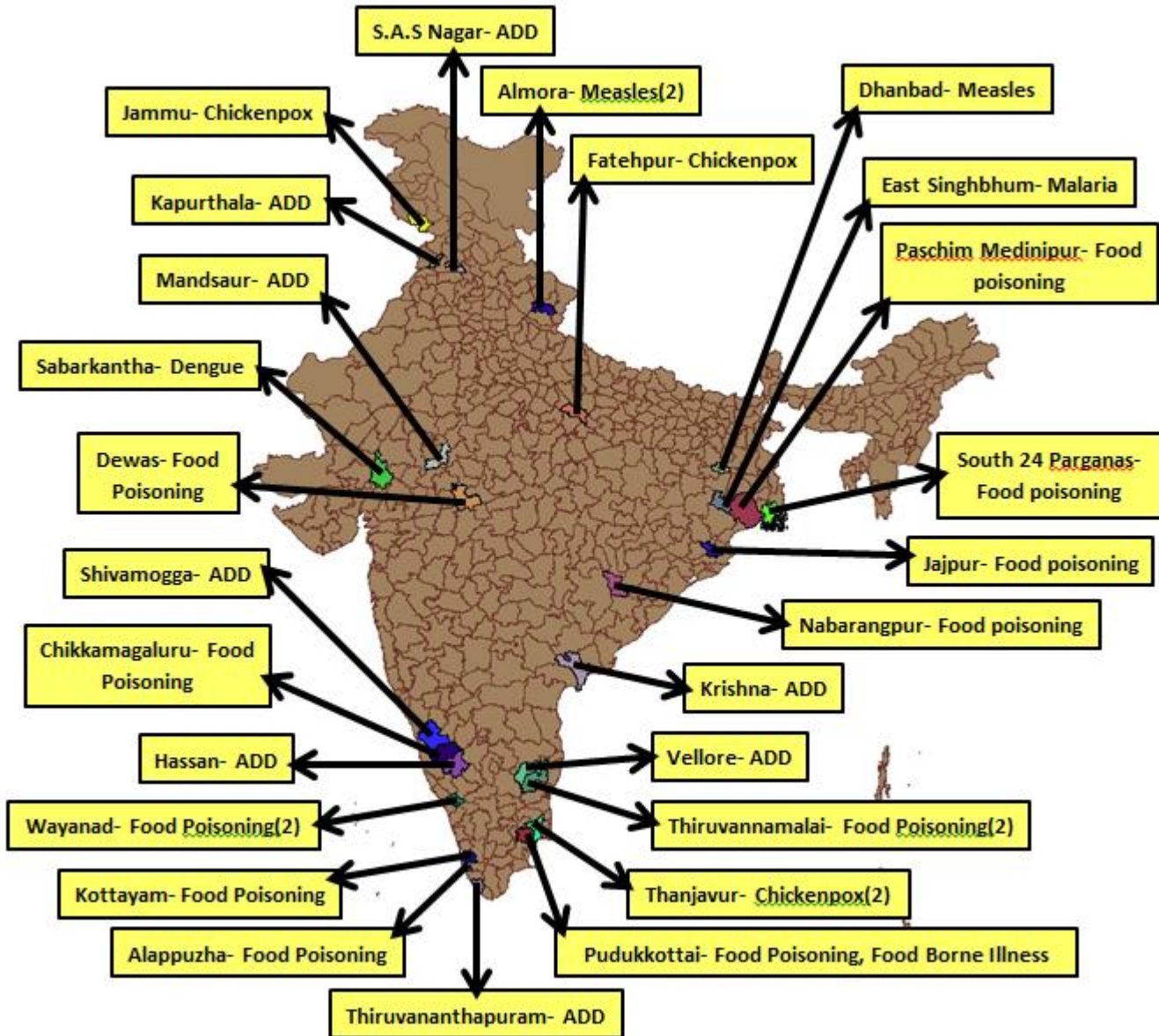

18th Week Map

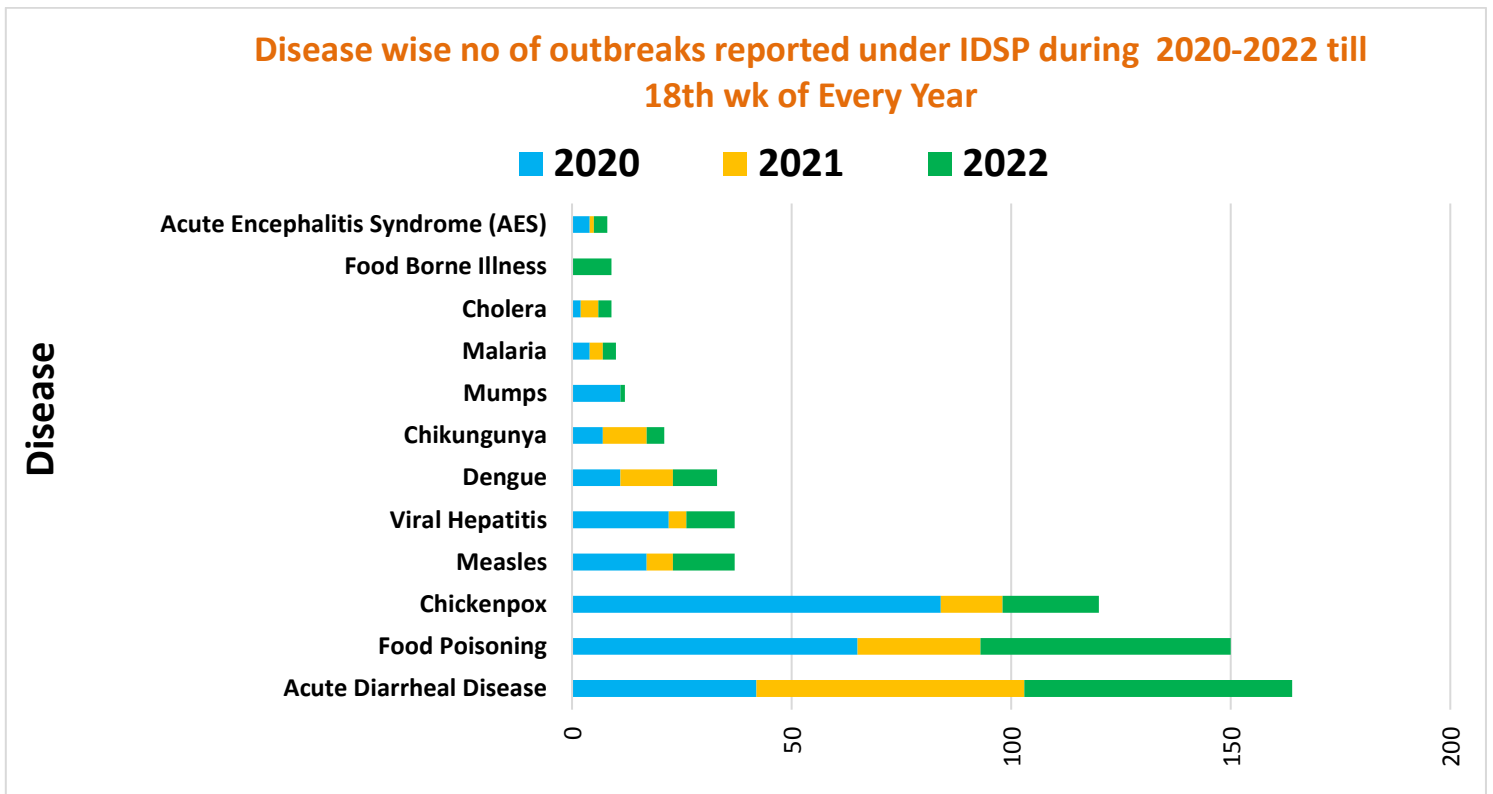
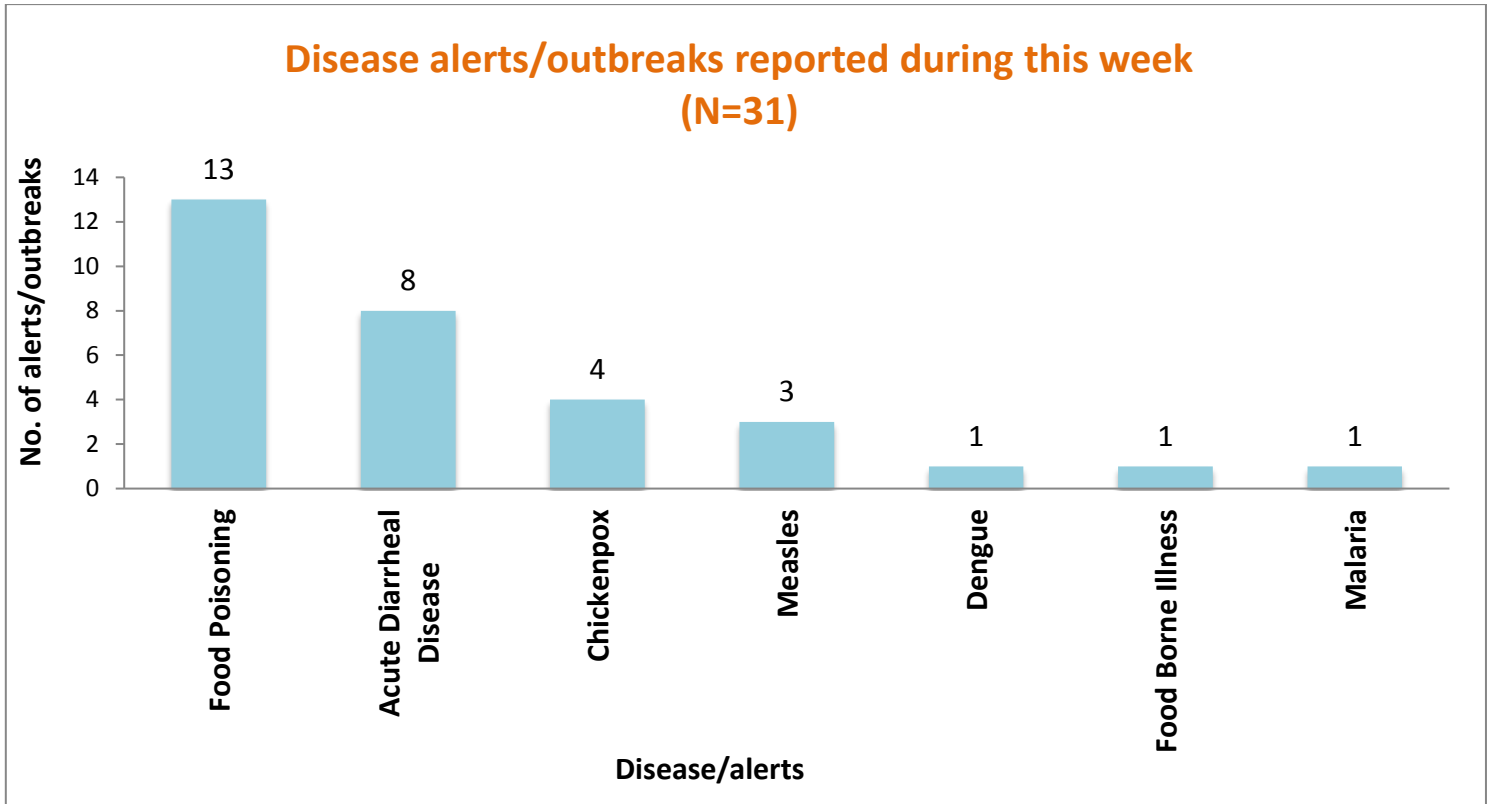

It was found that there was drainage water leakage in drinking water pipelines. House to house survey in the affected area was done. Disinfection and sanitation measures were taken. Health education was given regarding importance of safe drinking water and sanitation.

Out of four blood samples, one was found positive for Dengue by IgM ELISA. The deceased cases were 60, 70 and 73 year old males. District RRT investigated the outbreak. Medical camp was established at the site to diagnose early cases. Daily surveillance activities were carried out for active search of cases. Health education was imparted regarding the importance of vector control measures.

Frequent changes of bedding and personal belongings, adequate diet and plenty of fluids were emphasized upon. Screening was done in the village area for any case of fever with rashes. Vitamin A Prophylaxis was given. Health education was imparted regarding importance of personal hygiene.

Health education was given on the importance of immunization.

In stool samples, Actinobacter baumanii was isolated and blood samples tested negative for Hepatitis A and E and both the water samples were found to be potable. District RRT investigated the outbreak and All cases were given symptomatic treatment. Health education was given on the importance of safe drinking water and hand hygiene.
