Title:	Nine fell ill after eating bread from Khar outlet in district Mumbai, Maharashtra

Nine people, including a fourmonth-old baby, fell ill after they consumed garlic bread sold at a store in Khar on Saturday, police said. The Khar police registered a first information report in the matter and arrested the owner. The victims have been identified as Reshma Rahul Songare, 25; Radha Dhondiba Karande 40; Urmila Dhondiba Karande,20; Bhumika Ganesh Karande,14; four-month-old Geetika Rahul Songare; Yatik Dnyaneshwar Bhagat,18; Yogita Dnyaneshwar Bhagat, 43; Mohammed Hussain Sayyad Ali, 6 and 34-year-old Nazma Ali Karvelakar. All nine victims are residents of the Khar-Danda area.

The police said the incident came to light when several patients arrived at the Bhabha Hospital in Bandra on Saturday afternoon with similar complaints of diarrhea, nausea and dizziness. When the hospital staff inquired further, they noted that all the patients were residents of different localities and that all of them had claimed to have eaten food purchased from the same outlet the previous night.

A doctor from the hospital said the condition of all the patients was stable. The hospital informed the police about the food poisoning cases, who in turn started recording statements of all the affected people.

"We have registered a case against the fast-food outlet owner and he has been taken into custody," a police official said. "All of them had eaten the stuffed chicken garlic bread. Out of nine people who arrived at the hospital, two have been discharged after receiving treatment while the others are still in the hospital."

The Khar police have registered a case under section of Indian Penal Code for 272 (adulteration of food or drink intended for sale), 273 (sale of noxious food or drink), 336 (act endangering life or personal safety of others) and 337 (causing hurt to others) against the fast-food outlet owner.
